In a period of three weeks, ten youth invited Jesus into their lives. It all started the week before Pentecost Sunday at our Quw'utsun program. The evening included a Bible story, discussion, indigenous language, prayer, snacks and games. When I asked if anyone wanted to learn more about following Jesus, two youth put their hands up. After snack, the two youth who had showed interest ended up going out to play games so I asked again. One boy said he wanted to talk. I sat down with him and two of our team members and we explained how much Jesus loved him and how Jesus paid the price for all the things we do that dishonour God. We showed him a short prayer and asked if he wanted to pray to invite Jesus into his life and he said "Yes". We prayed with him and then began to discuss how to get to know Jesus better. As we talked with him, something happened that surprised us all. Youth started to come back into the bus to ask what we were doing. We explained what we were doing and asked them if they wanted to learn more. They all said "Yes". In the next half an hour, five more youth responded to Jesus. God's extravagant love was poured out! Thank you for your part in seeing young lives transformed!

Quw'utsun, Brayden (B: age 13, grade 9 at Cowichan Secondary School) and Joel (J: age 9, grade 3 at Quw'utsun Smuneem Elementary School).

- R: Where do you live?
- B: 5366 Mulagw Road
- R: What do you like about your school?
- B: Science and Art
- J: Math, raptor tag, lunch, recess reading and doctor dodge ball
- R: Who is your best friend?

- J: I have a lot. Can't decide. Okay, Dwayne Canute.

- J: Play some games, hockey, soccer, British Bulldog...We watch animated videos about God. We talk about the video and we get gummy bears for answering questions.

- R to B: ...Well, we will have to bless them (the gummy bears) before we start next time.
- B to R: You always forget to-I thought you would know that by now.
- R: It must have been weird the first time you saw a bus drive into your neighbourhood. What did you think it was? [the bus

parks right beside their home]

- B: I didn't see it.
- R: You eventually saw it. What did you think it was?
- B: A big blue bus passing by.
- R: You didn't think it was stopping then.
- B: No. I thought it was just picking people up.
- J: I was like, hmmmmm.
- B: Then it was there for two straight hours
- R: Then you started to wonder?
- B: Yah, what the heck is it? Then Joel goes out there.
- J: No, first let me explain. Well, the first time I was like "Whoo" - what's this? I was wondering so I was like "Hello, I'm 8 years old mate, can I go in?"
- R: We have a is a discussion about God after we watch a video. What do you actually talk about?

- B: Action Bible and a bunch of other Bibles

- J: Ask your Mom to! [to complete the consent form]
- R: Did you guys get your own Bibles?
- J: Yes, I finished it before this kid. [he finished reading the whole Bible before his brother]
- B: Yes.

R to J: You read it from cover to cover, the whole bible?

- J: Yes.
- R to B: Are you reading it too?

- B: Yes, I lost where I was.
- R: What was your favourite story?
- B: I don't have one.
- J: I can't tell with this kid...
- R to J: So you don't want to tell the story because you think it will ruin it for your brother who hasn't read that part of the Bible yet?
- J: Yes.
